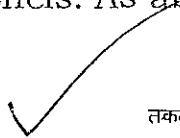

**Promotional Drilling :** In Annual Plan 2016-17, a target of 1.75 lakh meter of Promotional drilling (0.90 lakh meter in coal and 0.85 lakh meter in lignite) had been envisaged. As against this, the achievement of drilling upto the month of February, 2017 is 0.94 lakh meter, against the target of 1.56 lakh meter.

**Overall Progress of Detailed Drilling in 2016-17:** For 2016-17, a target of 11.0 lakh meter of drilling (Departmental: 4.0 lakh meter, Outsourcing: 7.0 lakh meter) has been envisaged. As against this, 9.71 lakh meter of drilling has been carried out upto the month of February, 2017, against the target of 9.78 lakh meter.

**Performance Review:** Performance review of CIL/ its subsidiaries, NLC, CIL, Coal Controller Organisation and Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation was held under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister of Coal on 21.12.2016 with specific reference of the achievement of the targets fixes for the period 2016-17 and also for determining the targets for the year 2017-18.
