## Promotional and Detailed drilling

<u>Promotional Drilling:</u> In Annual Plan 2015-16, a target of 1.75 lakh metre of Promotional drilling (0.988 lakh metre in coal and 0.762 lakh metre in lignite) had been envisaged. During the year 2015-16, the achievement of drilling upto the month of October ,2015 is 0.61 lakh metre, against the target of 0.84 lakh metre, registering a negative growth of 28% during the same period over previous year.

Overall Progress of Detailed Drilling in 2014-15: For Annual Plan 2015-16, a target of 15.0 lakh metre of drilling (Departmental: 4.0 lakh metre, Outsourcing: 11.0 lakh metre) had been envisaged. As against this, 5.44 lakh metre of drilling has been carried out upto the month of October, 2015 against the target of 7.11 lakh metre, registering a growth of 39% during the same period over previous year.
